Whole-church meetings

Services

There are services for all the church family at **10.00am**, **11.30am** (during university term-time only) and **5.00pm**. The 10.00am service has activity groups for children of all ages. There is a separate programme card with details available at the information desk.

Church Prayer Meetings

Come and join the church family for prayer at **8.00pm** on **Wednesdays 6th January, 3rd February** and **3rd March** in the church building.

Bible study groups

- **For everyone:** On Wednesday evenings there is a choice of iHUB (for international postgraduates and 20s-30s) at the Round Church, and Homegroups in local homes.
- **For men:** a breakfast meeting (called MEMBS) meets on Tuesday mornings in the church building, 7.00am-8.00am.
- **For women:** the international women's Bible study groups meet on Thursday mornings, 9.45am-11.30am, with a crèche for children.

Women's Bible study

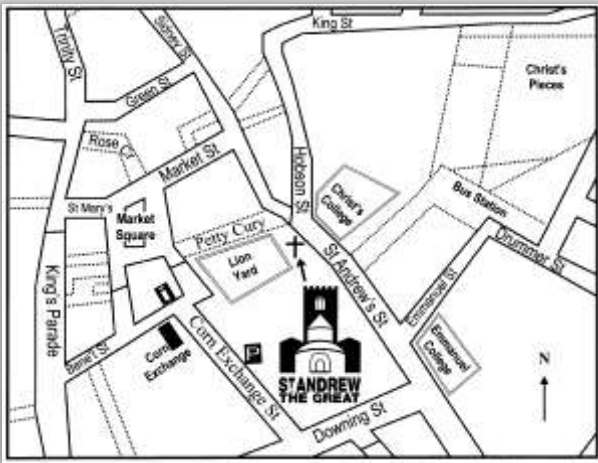
